McLaren Health Care, a premier \$7B integrated delivery system serving Michigan, seeks an innovative executive to serve as its next Vice President of Corporate Supply Chain Management.

This leader has responsibility and administrative accountability for McLaren’s \$1B enterprise-wide integrated supply chain portfolio covering clinical and non-clinical spend across the network’s footprint of acute, ambulatory, continuing care, and health plan operations. Key responsibilities include the identification and monitoring of system wide sourcing, contracting, value analysis, GPO compliance, procurement, logistics and distribution for all health system supplies, services and equipment. This position is also responsible for supply chain informatics and staffing.

With McLaren’s strategic expansion plans and growing investment in post-acute care services, this is an exciting opportunity for a senior leader to make an outsized impact with routine exposure to McLaren’s CFO, CEO, and leadership executive team as they sign off on new product decisions. The successful candidate brings a high-performance mindset with a clear focus on operational excellence, balancing physician and vendor relationship management to execute McLaren’s strategic priorities.

McLaren Health Care, headquartered in Grand Blanc, Michigan, is a \$7 billion, fully integrated health care delivery system committed to quality, evidence-based patient care and cost efficiency. The McLaren system includes 12 hospitals in Michigan, ambulatory surgery centers, imaging centers, a 640-member employed primary and specialty care physician network, commercial and Medicaid HMOs, home health, infusion and hospice providers, pharmacy services, a clinical laboratory network and a wholly owned medical malpractice insurance company.

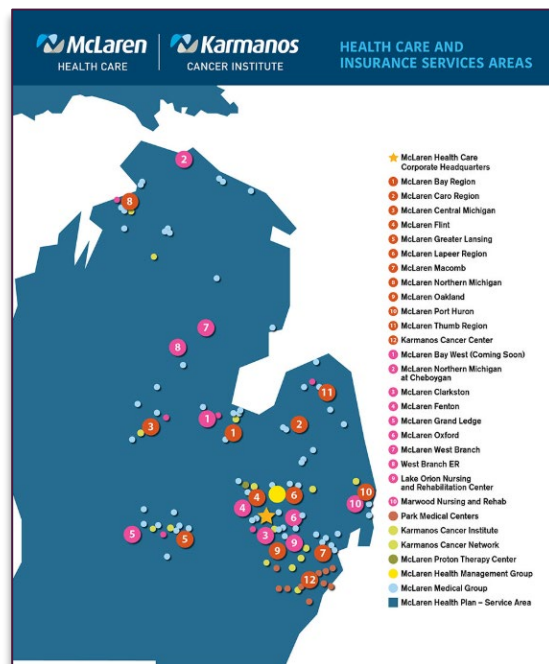

Warwick Hills Golf and Country Club is host to the Ally Challenge, an annual PGA Tour Champions event that brings Grand Blanc to the national spotlight one weekend a year.

The area offers many venues to enjoy the best of Michigan's great outdoors. The three area parks feature sprawling acres of wooded terrain home to an abundance of wildlife and waterfowl. Residents enjoy numerous recreational activities throughout the year, from biking and hiking to cross-country skiing and tobogganing.

Grand Blanc is perfectly situated in an ideal location, giving access to all that Detroit (one hour away) and Southeast Michigan offer, while also easily offering a trip North to Traverse City, Mackinac Island and the abundance of beauty in the Upper Peninsula. Detroit is hopping with events, festivals, sports teams, casinos, the Detroit Institute of Art and attractions like Campus Martius, Eastern Market, Corktown, and the Riverwalk. Heading North gives you access to more than 300 waterfalls across the U.P., Traverse City's wineries and vineyards, and the splendor of yesteryear on Mackinac Island, where there is no vehicle traffic permitted.

Staying local offers the opportunity to explore Genesee County, which has noteworthy activities of its own. The Flint Farmers Market is always a great way to spend a Saturday, especially after a visit to the Mott Estate, Applewood, which offers free entry and tours of the estate, as well as ongoing events throughout spring, summer and fall. The Flint cultural area offers the Longway Planetarium, the Sloane Museum, the Flint Institute of Arts, the Flint School of Performing Arts and the Whiting, where there is always a concert or show in the lineup. The city of Fenton also offers spectacular restaurants, shops and apple orchards for the quintessential Michigan fall. There is something for everyone in the Great Lakes state!

Leigh Anderson is an innovation catalyst and healthcare executive with 25+ years of experience managing billion-dollar P&L operations. With expertise in technology modernization, new product development, turnarounds, and scaling businesses through strategic innovation, Leigh is known for operational excellence to build next-generation healthcare systems. Since 2025, Leigh has been leading CIO and CTO work at McLaren Healthcare.

Before McLaren, Leigh was the Chief Operating Officer at Premier Inc., a national GPO and healthcare improvement firm. Joining Premier in 2013, he held the roles of CIO, SVP of Informatics and Technology Services, and President of Performance Services before being appointed COO in 2023. Key accomplishments during his tenure include directing \$1.35B P&L operations, transforming legacy supply chain solutions, and deploying leading AI cloud solutions among other market positioning initiatives. Leigh joined Premier from HCA Healthcare, where he was CIO for HealthTrust, after ten years with GHX, Inc. where he scaled the platform from start and prepared the organization for acquisition by Thoma Bravo.

Anderson earned an MBA from Wake Forest University School of Business and a BS in Industrial Engineering from Hofstra University. He is currently a board advisor for Qventus.

Supervisory Role

This leader will be responsible for oversight of a supply chain management team of approximately 141 FTEs, 41 of whom are centralized in the corporate office with the rest embedded in site departments across McLaren's footprint of facilities. Direct reports include three corporate directors responsible for vendor operations and system processing; business intelligence; value analysis, sourcing, and system operations; as well as site operations by region. As McLaren continues to assess insourcing vs. outsourcing decisions, there may be potential for this leader to shape the go-forward team.

Position Summary

The Vice President of Corporate Supply Chain Management is responsible for the strategic development and implementation of supply chain operations for McLaren Health Care Corporation. Responsibility includes the identification and monitoring of system wide sourcing, contracting, GPO compliance, procurement, logistics and distribution for all health system supplies, services and equipment. This position is also responsible for supply chain staffing and supply chain informatics.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities

- Directs McLaren Health Care system-wide supply chain management operations and processes.
- Oversees development of supply chain management operational standards as well as goals, objectives, policies and procedures.
- Confers with McLaren Health Care Senior VP and CFO in preparing departmental budget and multi-year fiscal planning controls. Monitors adherence to budget and initiates corrective action as necessary to ensure agreed-upon goals and objectives are met.
- Works cooperatively with McLaren Health Care executives and senior leadership for development and implementation of cost saving initiatives including the justification, purchase and control of expenditures of capital equipment, inventory, supplies and services to align with the organization's capital and financial strategy.
- Develops, secures approval of, and administers policies and budgets necessary to achieve approved departmental and corporate goals.
- Develops a system-wide strategy to reduce cost of supplies, equipment and purchased services through acquisition cost and utilization.
- Provides strategic direction of Value Analysis for McLaren Health Care service line committees to facilitate cost reduction, utilization, equipment lifecycle management, and standardization of supplies, equipment and service throughout the corporation.
- Leads and directs the negotiation of all contracts with vendors for all large equipment acquisitions to include, obtaining and reviewing bids, and comparing quality, availability, serviceability before awarding contracts. Develops policies designed to reduce the cost of supplies, equipment and services. Reviews contracts and/or agreements with vendors for accuracy on the written terms and conditions of the contract document. Plans, organizes, directs and controls the supply chain management operations including for the following:
 - Insource versus outsource decisions.
 - Evaluation, qualification and selection of vendors; the cost analysis, negotiation and selection of supplies and equipment; the negotiation of contracts; the evaluation of GPO contracts; the evaluation of vendor

- performance; purchase order processing and invoice discrepancy resolution.
- Reviews cost analyses, inventory reports, and related statistical data to remain current with the operational and financial status of supplies and equipment. Utilizes financial data to conduct analyses and makes recommendations and/or decisions, which have significant impact on the purchase of supplies, equipment and service.
- Provides cost-benefit analyses to substantiate decisions for supplies, equipment and purchased services decisions.
- Provides oversight of all facets of operational performance management such as supply chain systems, analytics, operational metrics, cost trends, price benchmarking, dashboards/scorecards, and KPI governance. In collaboration with finance and performance improvement and analytics teams, serves as the key owner and communicator of all business analytics for supply chain.
- Arranges and participates in meetings between vendors and/or hospital personnel to develop materials specifications, to control quality, and to resolve problems in receipt and usage of material.
- Ensures that the supply chain management staff accurately reports to requesting corporate and hospital department leadership on product selections, usage, price increases, vendor back orders, and related matters.
- Directs supply chain management quality assessment and continuous quality improvement activities across the system. Plans and develops programs designed to ensure quality improvement opportunities, goals setting, collection and evaluation of data, and quality action plans are achieved within functional area of responsibility.
- Collaborates with clinical leadership to drive user-friendly strategic sourcing and value analysis, bringing expert guidance and solutions related to leading practice purchasing methodologies and value analysis. Provides leadership in clinical standardization issues and acts as a business liaison to physicians, nursing, and other clinical staff.
- Serve as the primary liaison with McLaren GPO partner Premier to maximize all facets of the relationship.
- Communications: Communicates verbally and in writing in a positive, consistent, enthusiastic, and open mannered approach with all internal and external customers. Exhibits skill in communicating complex information at a level of understanding for the appropriate intended recipients.
- Decision Making: Uses independent judgment to exercise authority on behalf of McLaren Health Care Corporation by keeping the organization's mission, vision, and values at the forefront. Works independently in a self directed, non-confrontational, collaborative manner.
- Team Leadership: Supports, advises, promotes and advocates for staff, providing opportunities for professional and technical growth. Motivates staff; defines priorities and communicates organizational goals and works with them

to achieve them; seeks commitment from staff; and encourages innovation and team building/planning. Oversees regular staff meetings. Leads seamless culture-building across geographically dispersed teams.

- Translates the Vision and Mission Statement into strategic management interactions with staff and internal and external clients.
- Develops and enhances positive working relationships with McLaren Health Care senior staff, subsidiary and affiliate CEOs/CFOs and associates within the system.
- Displays a high level of initiative, effort and commitment to assuring highest quality output and standards, and continuous quality improvement.
- Ensures that supply chain develops and maintains a competitive advantage in the marketplace with leading-edge state-of-the-art technology as well as data & analytics resources and tools.
- Oversees risk mitigation strategies across the supply chain including the development of contingency plans to maintain supply availability during emergencies, disruptions, or shortages.
